bto appointed as Fife Council data protection training provider

The Data Protection Defence Team from bto solicitors (Paul Motion, Lindsay Urquhart and Laura Irvine) has been selected to provide data protection training to Fife Council following a competitive tender process.

The tender specified a requirement to train council staff handling sensitive personal data.

As the third largest authority in Scotland, Fife Council comprises 78 elected members and around 20,000 council officers/employees working together to design, develop and deliver over 900 individual public services across Fife.



Mr Motion who heads the bto team said: "We are very grateful to have been given this opportunity to share our team's experience.

"The Information Commissioner has made clear that adequacy of training is a factor he will consider in the event of a data breach, whether in the public or private sector."
